

Eagle Days

in Clarksville, Missouri



Bring your hats, mittens and hand warmers for Eagle Days. Take a drive with your friends to Clarksville to view thousands of America's official bird – the bald eagle.

Clarksville, Missouri is one of the notable winter Bald Eagle watching spots in the Middle Mississippi River Valley due to its proximity to Locks and Dam #24, which keeps the water free of ice enabling the eagles to find fish during the cold weather. Naturalists from the Missouri Department of Conservation, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the WBS set up spotting scopes, exhibits, children's activities, and live eagle shows to entertain and educate the public. Local community organizations and restaurants provide plenty of good food and the shops in town are open for visitors to investigate.



Visitors will have opportunities for great photos and to see these stunning and majestic birds up close and personal. Bonfires will help keep you warm and eagles will fly by to thrill you!

We will dine at The Lodge Restaurant in The Village of the Blue Rose, a beautiful, rural setting with a breathtaking view of the Mississippi River.
